Come To The 11th Annual Dairyville Orchard Festival & Fun Run

For those of us on the Dairyville Orchard Festival Organizing Committee, it is hard to believe that the 11th Annual event is just days away! We will also have a Fun Run prior to the start of the Festival for those of you who would like to have some fun on a run in the country (See page 5).

We would like to encourage you, your family, friends and neighbors to join us at the Festival on Saturday, October 18, 2008 from 10:00a.m.-4:00p.m. at Lassen View Elementary School (10818 Hwy. 99E, Los Molinos). The admission is free and so is the parking!

The Festival will open at 10:00a.m. with the local Boy Scouts carrying the American flag around the event area as the "Star Spangled Banner" is sung by Samantha Winning. This is a very special time and we welcome your attendance for this. Following the opening, you will be able to enjoy all that the Festival has to offer.

The Festival will have items of interest for everyone. There will be dozens of arts and crafts booths where very talented individuals will be selling their hand-made artwork, jewelry, furniture, candles, clothing, linens, scrap-books, painted gourds, soaps, wooden toys, framed pressed flowers, laser cut metal décor, tole painted items, wooden kitchen and decorator items, etc.

If you are interested in purchasing fresh local agricultural products such as walnuts, almonds, pistachios, pecans, dried plums, figs, etc., then visit the Agricultural Commodities Store in the center of the Festival grounds. Sunbursts, seasoned walnuts, and chocolate-dipped prunes will also be available. Free samples of some items will be available as well.

This is an event for all ages. The Diaper Derby will take place at noon in front of the stage. The Lil' Farmer's Corner will have free games and activities for the chil-

dren. A bounce house will also be available for the kids to expend a little of that extra energy that they will have. 4-H club members will provide a small animal petting zoo.

The California Highway Patrol, Tehama County Sheriff's Department and Cal Fire will have booths at the Festival. This is a terrific opportunity to meet these public servants and to ask them questions about car seat and booster seat safety and laws, driver safety, keeping you, your family and your property fire safe, use of the 911 system, etc.

A variety of live local entertainment will take place on the stage all day including: The Vina Singers & Signers, The Skillman Family Fiddlers, The Penner Family Singers, Loosely Strung (Bluegrass Fiddle) and Linda Roland & Friends. Raffle prize winners and other announcements will be broadcast throughout the day as well.

A large display of orchard and farm tractors and equipment will be on display at the front of the school grounds. Antique tractors and engines will also be there. The owners of these antiques will enjoy showing you how their equipment works and will answer your questions.

Author Alley will, once again, feature several local authors and their publications. Their books will also be available for purchase.

And ahh, the food! Come hungry and enjoy a delicious tri-tip sandwich, authentic carnitas, Oriental chicken salad, baked potato, and/or a hot dog. Quench your thirst with ice cold soft drinks and lemonade. Some hand-held foods will also be available for a very reasonable price.

While at the Festival, take a few moments to bid and re-bid on items at the Silent Auction. A variety of wonderful items will be on hand for you to bid on. There will also be a table filled with raffle prizes at the event. Buy your tickets throughout the day for a chance to win one of the many raffle prize items that will

be on display.

Festival t-shirts, raffle tickets, and Community Club memberships will be available at the Information Booth for purchase.
