The Festival will have items of interest for everyone. There will be dozens of arts and crafts booths where very talented individuals will be

selling their handmade artwork, crafts, olive oil and other agriculture-related items.

The Agricultural Commodities Store, which will be located in the center of the festival grounds under the big white canopy, will offer for purchase fresh local agricultural products such as walnuts, almonds, pecans, pistachios, dried plums, etc. A variety of Pacific Sun olive oils and vinegars, Sunbursts, seasoned almonds, honey & nuts, and chocolate-dipped prunes will also be available. Following your commodities purchase we encourage you to visit the Agricultural Education area where you will be able to learn more about the local crops, the Dairyville Community Club, Inc., and our scholarship recipients.

Even the little Festival visitors will have a special activity to participate in. The Diaper Derby will take place at noon in front of the stage and is for all youngsters who are crawling and have not yet begun walking. The Lil' Farmer's Corner will have an opportunity to join in the free "Fan Favorites" games and activities for the children. A bounce house will also be available for the kids to jump and play in.

The California Highway Patrol, Tehama County Sheriff's Department, and Cal Fire will have informational booths at the Festival. They will be happy to answer any questions that you may have about car seat installation, defensible space around your home, personal safety issues, etc.

A variety of live local entertainment will take place on the stage all day including: The Jonathan Skillman Family Fiddlers, The Debadoo Dance Company, Pat Scott Fiddlers, Kellie Rodriguez, the Vina Singers and Signers, and Linda Roland & Friends. Raffle prize winners will be announced from the stage throughout the day as well.

Festival guests will have an opportunity to see, up close, some of the latest models of orchard equipment and farm tractors which will be on display along Hwy. 99E at the front of the school grounds. Antique tractors and engines will also be on display there. The owners of these pieces of machinery will enjoy showing you how their beautifully restored equipment works and will answer your questions.

Author Alley will, once again, feature several local authors and their publications. All of these authors will have their books avail-

able for purchase and signing.

The Festival food is always a treat. Come hungry and enjoy delicious tri-tip sandwiches, authentic carnitas, Oriental chicken salad, baked potatoes with all of the toppings, and/or a hot dog. You will also want to grab an ice cold soft drinks, bottled water or lemonade to go with your meal. Hand-held foods will also be available for a very reasonable price.

**Youth Mile:** Run up Schaffer for .5 mile, and run back.
