event. The Festival will take place on Saturday, October 15, 2011 between the hours of 10am and 4pm at Lassen View Elementary School in Los Molinos.

For those of you who would like to take advantage of the fresh air and beautiful scenery, the day can begin with the Fun Run. Registration starts at 7:30am with racing beginning at 8:30am for the youth and 9:00am for those 13 years of age and older. The start/finish

line is on Schaffer Avenue, just north of Lassen View School.

All of the Fun Run and Diaper Derby details and the registration form are on pages 6-7.

We are fortunate, once again, to have Alan and Beverly Abbs, world-class athletes, as the coordinators of the Fun Run.

Come out and get your day off to a great start with a brisk run/walk in the country!

Come to the festival and enjoy a relaxing day listening to talented local musicians and vocalists as they perform on the stage.

You can partake in a delicious, freshly prepared meal such as a savory barbecued tri-tip sandwich and chips, authentic pork carnitas with beans and rice, a crisp oriental chicken salad with a fortune cookie, a piping hot baked potato with your choice of toppings, or a hot dog and chips. Add an ice cold soda or bottled water to finish off your meal.

Dozens of very talented artists, crafters and seamstresses will be offering a variety of handmade items for purchase. There is sure to be something of interest to everyone in attendance.

Community Service booths will also be set up to inform us all, and representatives will be on hand to answer your questions.

Once again, festival guests will have an opportunity to see some of the latest models of orchard equip-

ment and farm tractors which will be on display along Hwy. 99E in front of the gymnasium. Antique tractors and engines will also be on display there.

Author Alley will feature local authors and their books for those interested.

The Lil' Farmer's Corner will be set up for all of the kids. The games and activities in this area are offered for free, including the bounce house.

The Agricultural Commodities Store, which is always located in the center of the festival grounds under the big white canopy, will offer for purchase fresh local agricultural products such as walnuts, almonds, pecans, pistachios, dried plums, etc. A variety of Pacific Sun olive oils, Sunbursts, seasoned almonds, honey & nuts, and chocolate-dipped prunes will also be available. Free samples of some items will be offered as well.

Be sure to stop by the Information Booth and purchase a festival t-shirt, renew your Community Club membership or become a new member, and buy some raffle tickets for a

chance to win one or more of the many raffle prizes that are being offered. Prize winners will be announced throughout the day.

While at the Festival, take a few moments to bid and re-bid on items at the Silent Auction. Many businesses and individuals have contributed a variety of wonderful gift baskets, certificates, and other items for you to bid on.

Several Lassen View School classes will also display their scarecrows that have been entered in the Scarecrow Contest that is sponsored by the Dairyville Community Club, Inc. Be sure to check out all of these items specially created for the Festival. Come and see how creative the Lassen View students and their teachers are!

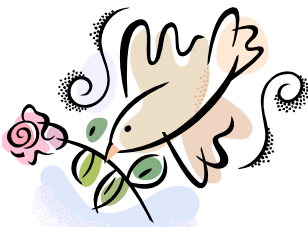
