of **\$2503.22** from the S.H.A.R.E.S. Program since May of 2010, according to Mary Christensen, our Club Treasurer. The money is used exclusively for college scholarships.

The way the program works is: The company that owns Save Mart, S-Mart, Food Maxx and Lucky supermarkets gives a 3% donation to the Community Club for every dollar that is spent at one of their grocery stores. Cardholders simply ask the cashier to swipe their S.H.A.R.E.S. card before they pay for their groceries and the DCC receives credits.


