The Sights, Sounds & Shopping at the 16th Annual Dairyville Orchard Festival

The third Saturday in October is right around the corner and that means it is Dairyville Orchard Festival time again! The Festival will be held on October 19th, from 10:00a.m.-4:00p.m. at Lassen View Elementary School (10818 Hwy. 99E, Los Molinos). The admission is free and so is the parking! This year the Festival will feature a variety of activities that the whole family will enjoy. We hope that you will join us!

The Festival will open at 10:00a.m. with the local Boy Scouts carrying the American flag around the event area as the "Star Spangled Banner" is sung. Following the opening, you will be able to enjoy all that the Festival has to offer.

The Festival will have items of interest for everyone. There will be dozens of arts and crafts booths where very talented individuals will be selling their handmade items.

If you are interested in purchasing fresh local agricultural products such as walnuts, almonds, pistachios, pecans, dried plums, figs, etc., then visit the Agricultural Commodities Store in the center of the Festival grounds. Sunbursts, seasoned walnuts, and chocolate-dipped prunes will also be available. Free samples of some items will be available for tasting.

This is an event for all ages. The Diaper Derby will take place at noon in front of the stage. The tiny crawlers will scooch and wiggle their way across the competition mats for the opportunity to win a Onesie® featuring the Festival logo. The Lil' Farmer's Corner will have free games and activities for the older children. A bounce house will also be available for the kids to expend a little of that extra energy that they will have.

Community Service groups will be on hand to answer your questions and provide you with information about the various services that they provide.

A variety of live local entertainment will take place on the stage all day. And yes, the fiddlers will be back! While at the Festival be sure to purchase some raffle tickets. The names of the Raffle prize winners and other announcements will be broadcast throughout the day as well.

A large display of orchard and farm tractors and equipment will be on display at the front of the school grounds. Antique tractors and engines will also be there. The owners of these antiques will enjoy showing you how their equipment works and will enjoy speaking with you.

Author Alley will, once again, feature several local authors and their publications. Their books will also be available for purchase.

Let us not forget the yummy food! Come hungry and enjoy a delicious tri-tip sandwich, authentic carnitas, Oriental chicken salad, and/or a hot dog. Quench your thirst with ice cold soft drinks, water and lemonade. Some hand-held foods will also be available for a very reasonable price.

While at the Festival, take a few moments to bid and re-bid on items at the Silent Auction. A variety of wonderful items will be on hand for you to bid on. There will also be a table filled with raffle prizes at the event. Buy your tickets throughout the day for a chance to win one of the many raffle prize items that will be on display.

Festival t-shirts, raffle tickets, and Community Club memberships will be available at the Information Booth for purchase.

New to the Festival this year is the 3rd Annual Giant Pumpkin Contest sponsored by the Tehama County Farm Bureau. According to Kari Dodd of the TCFB, 30 Pumpkin Contest applications have been received to date. Visit the Festival and see the pumpkins that your fellow community members have grown. We expect to see pumpkins of various shapes and sizes.
